

# What If...

## If you find signs of cultivation:

1. Get out immediately!  
Do not linger to take photos of coordinates.
2. Go back the way you came.  
You've already established that the route is safe.
3. Make as little noise as possible.  
If the garden is occupied, they may not be aware of you.
4. Get to a safe location.  
Run, walk, crawl or hide... just make yourself safe.
5. Notify FICC Dispatch.  
Use a phone if you have one. Criminals scan our radios.  
If you use your radio, be vague but make your needs clearly known.
6. Be prepared to provide your exact location.  
Coordinates are great but a physical description will do.
7. Get to your vehicle if possible  
If you can, drive away. Call for rangers to meet you.
8. Rangers WILL come to escort you out.  
No matter where you are or what time of day, if you are in danger, help will come.



# Safety First

## Before Going Into the Field:

1. Pre-Plan  
Know what to do and what to look for.
2. Check Area Status w/ Protection  
Is this a known problem area?
3. Ensure You Have Communications  
Do you have functional radios or phones?
4. Have a Safety Tailgate  
Brief your team on hazards & mitigations
5. Share Your Itinerary  
Tell someone where you will be
6. Check-In / Check-Out  
Let someone know your status
7. Travel in Pairs When Possible  
Groups are less likely to be confronted, more likely to see hazards, and can provide aide to each other.

## Remember:

Marijuana can grow anywhere there is water and a little soil.

Marijuana and marijuana gardeners require the same things as all people, plants and wildlife. Any location that has supported or could support humans, plants and animals is a potential garden.

# Be Alert

## Look Out For:



Black vinyl hose  
Fertilizer  
Root balls  
Signs of digging



Limbed or felled trees  
Camp structures made of native wood



Piles of dead stems  
Level, cleared areas  
Unusual trails  
Unusual litter on trails



Anything or anybody that seems out of place at that location.

Tip: Fresh marijuana smells a little like skunk.
